Picture Day

Picture day is on October 19th. Please have a look at the information below for if your child is absent for that day:

Information for parents of students who missed photos at school.

Your school's on time photo order deadline is printed in red on the absent proof attached.

Your child was absent on photo day at the school. We are sorry we missed you but you still can have your child's photo taken.

Bring your child to Watson's foto Source & Studio (#103, 12125-99 Street, Grande Prairie) to have their photo taken. **On time absent and retake** photo orders will ensure that your child will be included in the different products your school receives and that your photo package will be delivered to your school at the same time as your child's classmates.

Call your school office to get your child's unique key code if you didn't receive a proof sheet from your school. The keycode MUST come with you as it identifies your child for this special offer. You will also need this code for online ordering. If your child is new to the school, please ask your school's administrative assistant to email us your child's name, grade, home room, and ID number. We will then add your child to the school data and send a keycode back to the school to be shared with you.

These photos are done on a DROP-IN basis. No appointments are taken or needed.

You will approve your child's image by seeing it on a monitor at Watson's right after it is taken. The image you choose will be uploaded to **paquins.ca** by 5 PM the next business day.

It will be available to view and order by using the unique 8-digit key code you received from the school.

Retakes and Absent children photographed with orders placed by the deadline STILL QUALIFY for the family plan. Go to **paquins.ca** and check out our Help Tab for details on how to request the family discount for families with 3 or more children photographed by us.

If you are unable to have your child photographed by the above date, you have until Nov. 7th to still have your child photographed for this school year. Unfortunately, photos taken after the on time order date cannot be processed for the complimentary school photo products nor do they qualify for the family plan.

This proof is to be used to order and for you to keep.

Ordering Online is Easy and Gives You More Options!

Go to paquins.ca and use the unique blue key code that is on your child's picture proof to view the images. Click on your favourite images to choose from a vide selection of backgrounds to create a truly unique package. Packages can have a variety of different backgrounds and poses. You can add on retuckning and personalization of your child's name to your regular enlargements too. Once you have made all your selections, click to place your order!

If using your cellphone to order, rotate it horizontally to view all images and backgrounds offered.

Please note that there is a specified date marked in red to place your order by. On time orders are delivered to your school late orders are also placed online. Late online orders are subject to a processing and mailing fee.

Families with 3 or more children who attend schools photographed by

Paquin's are eligible for a FAMILY DISCOUNT.

Each child's order must be placed by the red "order by" date on their proof. Late orders do not qualify for the discount. Once *all of your children's orders have* been placed, send Paquin's an email to family plan®paquins.ca with the order codes, your child's names and the school each child attends.

I hope you will consider supporting Sock-tober this year!


















STEM Learning

On September 15th, the Head Start team, some of the other Grande Prairie Friendship Centre staff and the gentleman, Warren, from the city who helped us, gathered at the tree for a blessing ceremony.

Since then, the children have gathered at the tree and are learning some teachings about caring for our tree. They were pretty excited to share with their parents what they learned about loving the tree. They have layed tobacco and given thanks for the things the tree is going to teach them.

We look forward to all the activities and teachings we will share with the children and families for years to come!!







AHS Take Our Kids to Work Day is Back!

Alberta Health Services (AHS) is proud to announce our continued support of **Take Our Kids to Work™ Day**, which will be held on **November 1**, **2023**. This year, in addition to hosting students online, we are excited to offer students the option of attending in person where possible. The registration deadline is **October 31**, **2023**.

Take Our Kids to Work™ Day is a nationwide work experience program that allows grades 9, 10, 11 or 12 students to experience the realities of a real work environment by observing a parent, guardian, or AHS employee host at their place of work or by participating in our online event.

In the past, we have had schools streaming this virtual event in a designated classroom. This is an excellent way for a group of students who may not have access at home and cannot attend the in person event to still be included and engaged for the day.

The **online event** will be hosted over **MS Teams** and will feature speakers from different professions across AHS. The event will run from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., with a break for lunch. To participate in the online career exploration event, participants must register via the **online** event registration form here: https://form.jotform.com/232396759272266

The **in-person** event is for students who are interested in learning more about the career of a parent, guardian, or AHS employee host at AHS. Students participating in the **in-person** event must register via the in-person event registration form here: https://form.jotform.com/232396381696267

Participation by the student at a work site must be approved by the host's manager. Before approving a visit from a high school student, the manager and employee host must consider the following:

- Students must be supervised at all times.
- Patients, clients, and AHS employees must be made aware of the students' presence and consent to have the student observe.
- Students are not permitted to have cell phones or cameras at the workplace.
- Areas with high acuity patients, such as Emergency and ICU, are not recommended to participate.
- Students should not be exposed to areas where there are hazardous substances or dangerous equipment.
- Students and parents must review and sign the registration form on Insite and submit no later than October 1, 2023.
- Students are required to have received the rubella vaccine. It is also strongly recommended that the student have the following vaccinations and/or immunizations: pertussis (whooping cough), tetanus + diphtheria, measles, mumps, polio, hepatitis B, varicella (chickenpox), seasonal influenza and tuberculosis skin test.

Note: AHS infection prevention and control protocols will be followed at AHS sites.
