

Reminders For Parents



The speed limit on the ring road is 15km. We ask all parents who are dropping off or picking up to please slow down as well as, it is a one way road. Please make sure you are going the right way around the school. Thankyou kindly.

The colder weather is fast approaching. Please be sure your child/children are wearing appropriate outerwear in order to stay warm as they do go outside for recess and some gym classes. Please ensure that your child/children have indoor foot wear as well so as not to make the hallways full of water and mud.

Preventing Winter Slips



Winter weather can be fun, but ice and the freeze-thaw cycles can create dangerous walking conditions.

DID YOU KNOW:

- Winter conditions account for nearly 1/3 of all slip and trip injuries. Most will happen from Oct-Dec.
- Weather conditions at the start and end of winter (freezethaw) are when you are most likely to slip and fall outside.
- If you are in / on a parking lot, sidewalk, entrance, driveway or in a school drop off lane you are even more likely to slip.
- Salt and sand help, but it's not enough. You also must take steps to reduce your risk:



Use cleats on snow and ice
Using cleats when walking on snow and ice will greatly reduce your risk of falling.



Recognize that a summer puddles becomes winter ice

Puddles that occur in low points of parking lots will become icy during the winter months. They can be even more dangerous after a snowfall. Be aware of your parking area.

Buy a good pair of winter boots

Do your research, are your boots good for winter? Are they slip resistant and warm? Check out www.ratemytreads.com



Walk slow, with shorter strides

Don't rush and give yourself more time to get to work. Always step down off of curbs, never step out. Use 3-point contact when entering and exiting vehicles [3 out of 4 limbs contacting the vehicle until you are stable on your feet).





Walk flat foot style, push off your heel

Walk like a penguin - flat footed, toes pointed out, hands outside of pockets, get good balance and take-it-slooow.



Wipe boots when entering / exiting buildings

Keep soles clear of snow. Wipe boots dry before exiting buildings to prevent wet soles from freezing.





Ice is most slippery at 1 degree celcius Postpone or change activities

Watch the weather reports. Some days you may need to postpone or change planned activities. Consider less slippery options on days where the weather may increase the likelihood of ice being present. (i.e., spring freeze-thaw as the snow is melting, freezing rain, etc.).




IF YOU NOTICE SLIPPERY CONDITIONS ON OUR WALKWAYS OR ENTRYWAYS, ALWAYS:

Apply sand / ice melt (located in the entryways to treat the area)

Immediately report the conditions to the school admin **team.** (doing so will help to prevent others from becoming injured)






School Council

Dress Like A Teacher Day


On October 20th, we had Dress like a teacher day and our CPS students did not dissapoint!








Happy Halloween!

Staff and CPS students showed up with amazing costumes. It was a lot of fun for everyone. Way to go Wolverines!






































































































































































STEM Learning

This offers them an opportunity to obtain brief and memorable information on how the world works and why things are the way they are – from planets to plants, to animals and the human body!

In our rapidly changing world, STEM holds great potential for the future, and definitely seems like it is here to stay. With the right approach and <u>activities</u>, you can <u>help your kids engage with STEM learning</u> from young ages.

Amazing Facts About the Human Body

- 1. Body Composition: 50-65% water content.
- 2. DNA Connection: Humans share 99% DNA; 96% genetic likeness to chimpanzees.
- 3. Heart's Weight: Adults' hearts weigh 250-300g; babies' about 100g.
- 4. Vision Marvel: Human eye detects 10 million colors and distinguishes between them.
- 5. Oxygen Priority: Brain receives 25% of body's oxygen, influencing clarity and focus.


















































































APEGA Science Night






